- Founded in 1990
- Preserved more than 40,000 acres of open space

- Built and maintains 45 miles of trails
- Trail work relies on more than 400 volunteers a year
- Seven full time staff
- 3-4 seasonal employees







Conserved Lands Circa 1970





Conserved Lands Circa 2020


